ANCHORED IN CHRIST

“Waxing and Waning”

The ancient world paid a great deal of attention to the skies. Astrologers, astronomers, and even regular people noticed the moon's cycles, paid attention to the constellations, and used the skies to note seasons, special events, and the passing of time. Nowadays, we have apps for that work!

It is a shame, in my opinion, that we don't give more heed to the natural world. Many of us, myself included, live much of our lives sheltered inside, comfortable whether it is cold, hot, or storming outside. We lose sight of the fact that the world follows patterns, and so we also lose sight of the fact that our lives also follow patterns.

Just like the moon waxes and wanes, so do relationships, so does our health, so do our groups, and so does our relationship with God. Sometimes, there is nothing we can do to change a pattern, and sometimes, changing the pattern is the most important thing we can do. Every group, every family, and probably every individual, finds itself stuck looking at the same things in the same way. The upshot is that things that could be resolved remain unresolved. For instance, we are experiencing a cycle of not having as many youth in worship and small groups as we had in the recent past. As you can guess, youth graduate and go on to become young adults eventually. One way of seeing it is to look for the problem. A better way is to look at what we can do in the here and now. We can love the youth we have. We can build better connections with their families. We can make connections with schools and find ways to help youth in the community. We can prioritize reaching out to children and

young adults. In the short term, we may not have many youth, but if we reach out, we can have more youth in the future. Even if we don't, we can know that we are making a difference for the kingdom of God.

In some ways, the deck is stacked against the church right now. Statistics vary, but between 4,000 and 10,000 churches close their doors every year in our country, and something like 2.7 million members become inactive each year. Again, the numbers vary, but in the year 2000, the “churched” population was around 60% of Americans, but it is closer to 50% or below now. Books, articles, essays, and sermons have tried to find out why and address the issue. However, I think there may be simpler path forward: Would having Jesus in their life and the church part of their community make life better for people? If we answer yes, then we have our marching orders! If we answer no, then, we can sit back and let life happen.

The truth is, we cannot turn the tide that has been building strength for generations. But we can make a difference in the life (and the spiritual life) of people we know. That is, in my opinion, what we are here to do. God can use us to turn tides if God wishes, but we can love God and neighbor in the meantime. Love requires no more and no less. May we experience God's love so powerfully that we have no choice but to let it spill out to our neighborhoods. As warm weather turns cold, and as the holy days approach, may we find our spirits strengthening!

- **Outreach Possibilities:** With the holy days fast approaching, our congregation will have several opportunities to be in outreach locally and around the world. Last year, we promised 12 baskets and donated 22, so we are promising 15 this year. Last year, we gave gifts for 45 children and 15 youth, and we plan on doing the same this year.
- **Christmas Eve:** Christmas Eve falls on a Monday this year, so our plan is to keep our Sunday schedule (8:30 and 11:00am), and offer a 4:00pm Christmas Eve service geared for children and families, and an 11:00pm services – both will feature candles, carols, and communion. The 4:00pm service will also feature the fabulous Rainbow Puppets with assistance from our youth and young adults.
- **Music Sunday:** This year's music Sunday will be the second Sunday of December, the 9th. In view of all the extra work it involves to put together the choirs and musicians, we will be on a 5th Sunday schedule that morning: 9:15am Sunday School, 10:30am Worship. Also – don't forget we have an actual 5th Sunday (no meal) on December 30th this year.

Financial Fundamentals This periodic report briefly addresses finances at FUMC Fox Hill. The latest weekly and year-to-date information is printed weekly in the *Anchor* available at every service or in the church office.

Wow! Thanks for your **financial support** of your church. For the second month running I am pleased to report that not only are all of our bills – including our Apportionments –paid, but to date we have been able meet our desired mission support contributions and make our monthly set asides toward future maintenance costs. From designated “above and beyond” giving, we were also able to make \$350 in additional mortgage payments and ended the month with a mortgage balance of \$328,873. Keep up the great support!

Our **2019 budget/spending plan** was approved at \$629,452, essentially the same amount as for 2018 [down \$140].
